# A BILL

To fully fund America's public road and bridge building, upgrades, and maintenance.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. UNITED STATES TREASURY.
- 4 In the spirit of the American intent to secure the
- 5 blessings of liberty and to promote the general welfare
- 6 combined with the congressional authorities to create
- 7 money and establish post-roads, the United States Treas-
- 8 ury shall create new money to be spent, not lent, in lieu
- 9 of taxation, borrowing, and bonding for the sole purpose

- 1 of paying for labor and materials that go into the building,
- 2 upgrading, and maintenance of America's public roads
- 3 and bridges.

### 4 SEC. 2. UNITED STATES CONGRESS.

- 5 The United States Congress has given the Treasury
- 6 the power to monetize the peoples' production free of ex-
- 7 pense by issuing a medium of exchange that is debt free
- 8 and spent into circulation as an earned payment in lieu
- 9 of borrowing, bonding, or taxation for production that all
- 10 citizens need, use, benefit from mutually, and that pro-
- 11 motes the general welfare, the building, upgrading, and
- 12 maintenance of public roads and bridges.

#### 13 SEC. 3. PROCESS.

- 14 (a) In General.—Public roads and bridges shall be
- 15 built under the same process as is in effect on the date
- 16 of enactment of this Act. Citizens at the local level, not
- 17 legislators, shall decide how and where roads or bridges
- 18 need to be built, repaired, upgraded, and maintained to
- 19 best serve their needs. This shall be done as is current,
- 20 by citizens living in the jurisdiction of each city, township,
- 21 county, and State government through their elected offi-
- 22 cials and in coordination with each other. The unit of gov-
- 23 ernment making a request for funds shall hire engineers
- 24 to design the project and prepare a detailed written de-
- 25 scription of the planned project. As is current, the private

- 1 contractor meeting the bid specifications with the lowest
- 2 and best bid shall get the job.
- 3 (b) BID AMOUNT; OVERSIGHT.—A copy of the ac-
- 4 cepted bid described under subsection (a) shall be sent to
- 5 the Comptroller of the currency requesting that new
- 6 money be created for the bid amount and delivered to the
- 7 local project authority for spending to pay salaries of la-
- 8 borers and material providers. The Comptroller's only
- 9 oversight shall be to ensure the project and contractors
- 10 are real and the jobs are completed to bid specifications.

#### 11 SEC. 4. TREASURY MONEY.

- 12 (a) IN GENERAL.—The United States Treasury shall
- 13 stamp coins, print or create direct deposit electronic
- 14 money, and spend it directly without debt, interest, or fee,
- 15 to the unit of government requesting it, in lieu of bor-
- 16 rowing, bonding, or taxes. The money supply established
- 17 under the subsection shall only increase with productivity
- 18 gains resulting solely from public road and bridge projects.
- 19 (b) Currency Specifications.—Paper currency
- 20 printed under this Act shall be the same as current minus
- 21 any Federal Reserve Bank symbol or seal, minus the
- 22 words "Federal Reserve Note" and "this note is", and
- 23 minus any Federal Reserve reference.

## 1 SEC. 6. AUDITING FOR TRANSPARENCY.

- 2 Federal and legislative auditors through the Comp-
- 3 troller General of the United States shall ensure an ongo-
- 4 ing and accurate accounting of the total amount of money
- 5 created to fund projects under this law by recording the
- 6 road authority name, project, total amount of project
- 7 money created, the date and time money was forwarded
- 8 by whom, and to who, and verify that the road authority
- 9 for each project received the payment. The Comptroller
- 10 General shall update the accounting described in this sec-
- 11 tion monthly with individual project descriptions and costs
- 12 and total nationwide costs making such available on the
- 13 website of the Government Accountability Office by the
- 14 first business day of the third week of each month.
- 15 SEC. 7. CRIME DEFINED; PUNISHMENT ESTABLISHED.
- Any person violating any provision of this Act shall
- 17 be guilty of a felony and shall make restitution. Any viola-
- 18 tion of this Act which results in the corruption of the cur-
- 19 rency may be punishable by death.
- 20 SEC. 8. ALL INCONSISTENT ACTS REPEALED.
- 21 All Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with the provi-
- 22 sions of this Act are hereby repealed.
